 California was the first to pass NIL legislation on September 30th, 2019


NIL rules went into effect on July 1st,
2021

 Rules in place for 34 states at the collegiate level and 28 states at the high school level

 Football and men's basketball represent majority of NIL compensation

Many rules/policies across the country





SELF-EFFICACY

- Defined as when a person is confident in their ability to succeed
 - Self-efficacy vs self-esteem
- Connected with a student's academics
 - Strategies and goals, mental health, and GPA
- Connected to college athletes
 - Physical activity, sport participation, and successful performance
- Confidence has been linked to a collegiate student-athlete
- Self-efficacy theory

ATHLETE IDENTITY & ACADEMIC IDENTITY

Athlete Identity

- Described as the degree an individual identifies with the role of an athlete
- AIMS is a prominent instrument to measure
- Related to athlete burnout

Academic Identity


- Limited definitions in higher education but exist in professional concepts
- Core elements and concepts
- Theoretical framework to build a student's identity





SOCIAL SUPPORT

- Defined as the perception individuals have of the available social resources
- The conservation of resources model
- Related to athlete burnout
- Multi-dimensional construct
- Directly connected to self-efficacy
